

IMPORTANT FACTS TO REMEMBER:

- 1. Is my child protected and monitored?
- 2. Will my child be able to do his/her homework if we don't have internet access?
- 3. Who is responsible to pay for damage caused by misuse?
- 4. Who else can use this iPad?
- 5. Will my child bring the iPad home each evening?

Basics: Devices at School

- 1) In Kindergarten- Second grade your child will leave their iPad Mini at school.
- 2) iPads are protected by Otterbox cases, which should never be removed.
- 3) Take care of your device-No Stickers, marks, or scratches
- 4) iPads are assigned to each student- he/she should be the only one using it.
- 5) iPads will be charged and ready for your child







Basics: Taking Devices Home

- 1) In Third- Fifth grade your child will bring their iPad home each night.
- iPads are protected by Otterbox cases, which should never be removed.
- 3) Take care of your device-No Stickers, marks, or scratches
- iPads are assigned to each studenthe/she should be the only one using it.
- 5) Charge the iPad fully each and every night
- 6) Do not expose the iPad to extreme temperatures of moisture
